### Computer Group Meeting

The branch genealogy computer group meeting was held on Sunday 27 January 2019.

Ann Evans explained some large index databases that she has compiled. These are from various books which she has gone through, page by page, extracting names for the index. Some of these books focus on the Taranaki and Northland areas, and there are also many that cover all of New Zealand and the NZ military.

Murray Evans talked about the importance of doing a backup of your data. A computer hard drive can fail any time, and your data is lost if you don't have a backup. But you also need to check out how to restore from backup, as this is not always that easy.

On the same day, we discovered that one of the hard drives on one of the branch computers had failed. This rather proved Murray's point, and now we will get to see how good our backups have been.

Welcome to another year of Genealogy! I hope you have all had a good break over Christmas and New Year and are enjoying the hot weather we are experiencing at the moment.



## Family History Expo: 1 – 6 April 2019

The Hawera Genealogy Group are holding a week long Family History Expo from 1 to 6 April 2019 at the Hawera Community Centre, which will be open between 9am and 3pm each day. It will comprise a variety of events culminating in a family and local history expo with representation from all of Taranaki.

During the week, there will be cemetery walks, presentations in local libraries and museums. In the Community Hall on Saturday, there will be a Women's Suffragette Display, talks or presentations, photos, memorabilia, family histories, a display of machinery on the forecourt, and anything to do with family and local history of Taranaki. The 2019 meetings are planned for 7 April, 9 June, 11 August and 6 October. There is no meeting in December.




The beginning of our branch isn't the only important thing that happened in 1969. That year, the number 1 hit singles in New Zealand included:

- Diana Ross & Supremes: *Love Child*
- Bee Gees: *I Started a Joke*
- Beatles: *Get Back*
- Rolling Stones: *Honky Tonk Women*
- Shane: *Saint Paul*

Then unknown rock group Led Zeppelin released their first album, *Led Zeppelin*. Without a record company contract, they had to fund this recording themselves, but they followed up with some commercially very successful albums.



The last two of the Beatles albums *Let It Be* and *Abbey Road* were released in 1969. The band's final public performance was on the roof of Apple Records in London, and the group split up soon afterwards.



The three day Woodstock music festival was held in New York state in August 1969. It was the first music festival of its type and is seen as pivotal in music history and in the counter culture generation.


