Last Event: Mobile devices for genealogy

At the February branch meeting, Peter Hewett provided an update on the sorts of mobile devices currently available, and how these can be used for genealogy. These devices are the smart phones and tablets that we are seeing more and more.

A survey in 2013 reported that 60% of New Zealanders have a smart phone and 19% have a tablet. There are two popular types; devices running Android (phones and tablets by Samsung, HTC, LG, Asus and others) and those running iOS (iPhones and iPads by Apple).

Apps are the name for software programmes that you can install and run on your smartphone or tablet. There are lots of these, some are free and some you pay for.

Some of the on-line genealogy services (Ancestry and MyHeritage) provide apps that enable you to access and edit your online database. Another approach is taken by some desktop computer software (Legacy and Reunion) which provide apps that synch with your desktop and enable you to read and edit your data from your mobile device.

Most apps on the mobile devices need an internet connection to work. Connection can be done via wifi or the cell phone network. Wifi is cheaper but only works when you are within range of the wifi. The cell phone connection (also called 3G) needs a SIM card and a mobile phone account. The cost of these can vary widely, so check out the details. The Consumer website Telme can help with this.

Common Mistakes in Genealogy

Sometimes, I find that a reminder or refresher can help me remember stuff I have forgotten. So here are a couple of tips you probably already knew.

Surname spelling: These days, people are much more careful about how they spell their name than their ancestors were 200 years ago. Don't limit yourself to just how you spell your surnames, think laterally about all the different ways it can be misspelt.

Rushing: Don't jump to a conclusion the instant you see a name matching your search. Take your time and check for other clues. Get 3 or more pieces of evidence to establish an identity or link.

Others' research: Family trees compiled by other people can be tempting, but don't just copy them. Use them as clues, but do your own research.

Siblings: Don't just research your direct ancestors, check out their siblings and neighbours as well. This gives a wider picture of the life of your ancestors, and can uncover facts that wasn't recorded with your ancestor. Looking around can uncover information or leads that wouldn't have been available otherwise.

Sources: Carefully document your sources. This is essential for resolving conflicting information later, and for avoiding wasting time repeating the same research.
