
Merry Christmas

November Meeting - Facebook

Last month's meeting was about Facebook. Sharyn Guthrie gave the talk, giving us tips on how to set up a page safely with the right security settings, to make sure you are safe online. Facebook can be a big help with genealogy. Sharyn showed how to join other groups. There are many groups you can join about your favourite subject, area or even family Facebook pages. I am a member of two such pages, and old photographs, birthdates and information is often shared. There are user groups for places like Ancestry and Family Search – places you can ask questions about things you don't know how to do, or a problem you've encountered. There are many Facebook pages about DNA, history and fun pages like "You know you lived in New Plymouth" which often has old photographs posted which bring back many memories for people. You can also use Facebook to try and find relatives and make contact.

DNA Group: Sunday 20 November

We were privileged to hear a presentation by Donna Rutherford, UK genetic genealogy specialist. Donna is from New Plymouth originally, and she is now living in the UK. While in New Plymouth visiting family, she generously gave us an inspiring talk on "Solving Genealogical Puzzles with DNA".

Donna explained how to do the three steps to research with DNA.

- cluster DNA matches to create genetic networks
- build research trees, quick & dirty to explore relationships and possibilities
- solve genealogical puzzles to verify relationships to common ancestors

She outlined a recommended strategy for approaching your DNA research, and also went through some cases to illustrate how these techniques were applied to find biological parents and solve genealogy puzzles.
