Getting your DNA tested

At our May meeting, Graeme Jury gave a talk about things you should consider before getting a DNA test for genealogy.

Graeme explained what you can expect from a DNA test. He summarised the various companies that provide DNA tests, and some of the key features provided by each of them.

DNA testing doesn't replace traditional genealogy methods, but it is a great way to confirm relationships and to find distant cousins.

But be prepared to uncover some unexpected results. DNA tests might show that some people don't have the biological parents that everyone thought they had. This can be upsetting for some people, so be careful out there.

Papers Past

The website <u>Papers Past</u> has digitised scans of historic New Zealand newspapers. It is free to use, provided by the <u>National Library</u>.

This is a great resource for genealogists, and also for historians, researchers and lots of others.

The old newspapers are searchable, so you can look for your ancestors across different regions and time periods. This is great for finding

- birth, death and marriage notices
- · court reports, inquests
- sporting events
- · social events
- ship passenger lists

The type of information that gets into newspapers varies over time, so it can be a bit of a lucky dip as to whether your ancestors were documented in the newspaper.

Be sure to go back and check if you didn't find what you are after. More newspapers are added all the time. In May 2023, the following additions were made:

- Grey River Argus (1936-1949)
- Hauraki Plains Gazette (Aug 1921-1950)
- Hawke's Bay Tribune (Oct 1936-Jan 1937)
- Manu Rere (Cook Islands) (Nov-Dec 1870)
- Otago Witness (1927-Jun 1932)
- Press (1980-1989)
- Samoan Reporter (Mar 1845-May 1862)
