Battle of Fromelles 1916

In WW1, the <u>Battle of Fomelles</u>, on 19 & 20 July 1916, resulted in over 5300 casualties from the Australian Imperial Force, including many New Zealanders. The <u>Fromelles Association</u> is seeking to name the dead soldiers, and to contact the families of those who have been named.

NZ soldiers include Charles Conroy, Clark Maxwell Gray, William Fletcher, Harry Forster, Andrew M Given, Edwin Lawler, William James Lund, Herbert James King, Shrewsbury F Kingsford, Horace Maidment, James L Mason, Beresford Nelson, Henry Oscar Nelson, Albert E Pratt, Arthur C Pybus, Robert Douglas Sloan, James Sexton and Edward Coady.


